Psychology of Religion and Mediation



Problems (mostly muslim and eastern country immigrants)



- Parallel societies in European cities
- Religious rules more important than secular law (Sharia, treatment of women)
- No interaction of religious groups
- Enemy image of the other religions in society
- No participation in democratic systems

- Education
- No contact with children outside of one's own communities
- Language
- Religious indoctrination
- Knowledge of
 - democratic structures
 - cultural traditions
 - school and education programs





Problem group III - MEN

- Education and language
- No contact with persons outside one's own communities
- Violence instead of dialogue
- Religious indoctrination
- Missing identification with
 - democratic structures
 - cultural traditions
 - basic human right traditions and laws




Intensified academic preparation
