

TYPES OF INCIDENTS




Incidents can consist of several acts.



Highlighted

In June, the Mission supported a workshop in Mostar to discuss preventing hooliganism and bias violence. Participants examined root causes, impacts on interethnic relations, institutional gaps, and roles of education and family. Held as part of the Action Plan for Strengthening Social Cohesion of Mostar, the event emphasized prevention, legal mechanisms, and dialogue. The Mission will support related research.

The Hate Monitor provides an update on all potential hate-motivated incidents and responses known to the OSCE Mission to BiH at the time of publishing the report.
