















In December, the Mission completed two six-month projects by successfully training 39 participants from 25 CSOs in social research methodology. These projects in Banja Luka, Gradiška, Mrkonjić Grad, Prnjavor, Teslić and Trebinje seek to collaboration between civil society and local authorities, with the CSOs producing valuable research social cohesion perceptions in their respective communities.
