



On 21 and 24 July, CaHs from Livno and Drvar organized events to raise awareness about offensive graffiti. These included a workshop titled "From street art to criminal act", followed by a women's street basketball tournament gathering players from Glamoč, Drvar and Livno. These events allowed for a follow-up workshop to develop the Livno Community Cohesion Action Plan, while also using other best practices from Dobo.
