FACTS MATTER

- Between 17 and 30 June, the SMM confirmed that eight civilians were injured. This brings the total number of civilian casualties since 1 January 2019 to 65 (seven deaths and 58 injuries).
- The SMM observed damage caused by small-arms fire and shelling to civilian property and infrastructure in numerous locations along the contact line.
- The SMM recorded over 14,350 ceasefire violations (compared with over 14,700 in the previous two-week period).
- The Mission observed 134 weapons in violation of the agreed withdrawal lines (125 in areas not controlled by the Government); and mines and unexploded ordnance, including 46 anti-tank mines near Shyrokyne, and another 25, approximately 600 metres to the east across the contact line.
- On 26 June, the Mission monitored the beginning of disengagement near Stanytsia Luhanska. Chief Monitor Yaşar Halit Çevik issued a statement welcoming the sides' willingness to disengage and urging them to take the necessary measures to make disengagement durable and sustainable (<https://www.osce.org/special-monitoring-mission-to-ukraine/424103>). Over the next days, the SMM continued to monitor the process through increased presence in the disengagement area.
- On 23 June in Kyiv city centre, the SMM saw about 3,000 law enforcement officers maintain order, allowing about 5-6,000 people exercise their freedom of assembly and expression, namely of their support for equality, despite the presence of 300 counter-demonstrators, some of whom showed hostile intentions towards the pro-equality marchers.
